Many of the sessions were new to us and the students, which was exciting as we love new learning opportunities. We are so thankful that Parkside has such a wonderful school community who are willing to come in and spend time with our students and share interesting and fun activities with them all. From all of us in the Lower ELMO team, thank you to the many session leaders and helpers who made our January multi-activity learning time so memorable!

January 23rd to 27th was Parkside Literacy Week and the students had so much fun! Thank you to all the families who donated to the book swap, our students were excited to have some new books to take home. We had some awesome guest readers throughout the week which the students always love. It was great to be able to take part in "read around the school" again this year. It is a great opportunity for students to be able to read with other peers outside of their classroom and in a spot, they may not be able to read in often. It was great to see so many families come for the family to read around the school afternoon too.

Our Lower Elementary classes continue to learn and grow this month. In Science we have begun an exploration in the Matter unit which is all about properties that can be changed and include, size, length, shape, texture, and actions that physically change the properties of an object include bending, twisting, stretching, cutting and breaking. Matter is a shorter unit, so we will explore the Energy unit too, which is about building and creating using energy. In Social Studies, all our Lower ELMO classes are taking turns learning about a different country around the world which include, India, Ukraine, Peru and Tunisia. Make sure to find out which country your child is currently studying in class. Students will learn about geography, landscapes, food, clothes, religion, animals, and

culture through these units.

February may be a short month, but it is a busy one for us at Parkside. We have our family Valentine's Day Dance, the Parkside Identity Fair, Random Acts of Kindness Day, Community Kindness Week as well as Pink Shirt Day. We are so excited for all February has to offer.

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# Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Greetings from Upper ELMO!

The start of 2023 has been wonderful, with students were eager to get back into their learning routines after winter break. January was an icy month outside, but our classrooms were warm with the passion of learning burning strong!

In Math, students continued exploring, extending, and describing various sequences. They can determine if the sequence is arithmetic (adding or subtracting) or if it is geometric (multiplying or dividing). They have also started statistics by creating their own surveys. Using the data that they collect from their classmates; they have and will continue to interpret and display it in different graphs and charts!

In Language, students are refining both descriptive and functional writing. It is great to see students seek out feedback from one another during work block which is making their writing even better! We appreciate the revising and editing suggestions that some of our confident writers are sharing. Literacy Week was a huge success, we absolutely loved reading with our friends and siblings around the school and having special guest readers share their love of reading with us. Dressing up as a book character was also a highlight of the week and many students had fun with bringing their favourite book to life!

In Science our grade sixes have been wrapping up their inquiry into sky science. They especially enjoyed seeing videos of Commander Chris Hadfield demonstrating life aboard the International Space Station. Our grade fives have continued with the chemistry topic and have spent a lot of time in the practical life room baking muffins, making Jello, and even using salt for ice cream in a bag! Coming in February will be a new topic of weather watch! Our grade fours have completed scientific methods review and will begin to work with light and shadows.

In Social Studies our grade sixes are finishing up their study of Ancient Athens. They are enjoying presenting their projects to the class before we move on to study the Iroquois Confederacy. Our grade fives have continued building their mini book library, listening to stories of Vikings, English and French, and other immigrants from around the world. Our grade four students have completed their journey of Alberta, its resources, and communities. This month they will be starting our journey into the histories of the peoples and the land of Alberta.

In Art, we focused on printmaking and will be diving into fabric arts next. If you have an interest and want to lead a small group in knitting, crocheting or other fabric arts please let us know! In Music, we have started recorders. It is important that your child has a recorder and brings it to school for their music class. Health has centered around building a growth mindset and the power of yet! We look forward to seeing the many diverse and special parts of our Parkside family with our upcoming Identity Fair.
