Hello Casa families and Welcome to November!

The month of October was a busy one for our classes and we have seen so much growth in the students' abilities as well as how they interact with one another. Looking back, In October we learned about sorting cutlery, played with different materials in our sensory bins and began focused learning of letters. The students have been practicing their mindfulness strategies that they have been taught as well as reflecting on what zone they feel they are in.

As the weather has begun to shift, we are still planning to find time to explore the outdoors throughout the winter. Please ensure you are sending your child to the school in the appropriate gear. This includes a hat, snow pants, jacket, and mittens or gloves. In November along with finding time to spend outside we have our school Remembrance Day Assembly, School Spirit day, a M.A.L.T. morning, and our Celebration of Learning!

We are so excited to see how the children continue to learn, grow, and play within our classrooms and watch as their relationships with one another develop further. Our Casa classrooms will be beginning an inquiry project as we explore how animals prepare for winter. The goal is to have students deepen their understanding of animals through our new Science curriculum, as well as develop new knowledge of how life changes throughout the seasons.

Please note that there is no school for our Casa students, on Friday, November 24th. November 24th is a full day of Celebration of Learning for our Casa teachers. Happy November Parkside Families!

It is hard to believe that October is already over! We had a busy October in ELMO123. We are continuing our Montessori Great Lessons by presenting lessons three, four and five and are extending our learning through timeline studies and Practical Life. In addition to the Great Lessons, we will continue our mapping unit and will focus discussions on the Acadian community of Meteghan, Nova Scotia. In Science we are continuing our exploration of landforms such as plateaus, mountains and hills and will be exploring UNESCO World Heritage sites found in Alberta. In Math we will be continuing to reinforce our understanding of place value as well as patterning. Students will learn about repeating and non-repeating patterns found in nature/architecture, as well as increasing and decreasing number patterns. Some language you can use with your child in Grade 1 is 'What is a core?' (the part of the pattern that repeats) or 'How many times does the Core have to repeat itself to make a pattern? (at least 3 times). As the Holiday season approaches, we will continue practicing Grace & Courtesy through our Peace Curriculum.

Students and teachers are busy assessing for Term One report cards. We thank you for your continued encouragement with your child's learning. We look forward to our upcoming Celebration of Learning to connect with you!

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Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello ELMO456 families,

October was gone in a blink – but we packed in some new learning projects, special guest presentations such as drumming with Al Crawford and building our mental health capacity with Grade 5 and 6 students. It has been areat to have Miss Jancey, our Division Wellness Coach, share her expertise on how to balance peer relationships and emotions! Grade 4 will be starting their work with her in a couple weeks. Upper ELMO students did an excellent job planning, setting up and hosting fun Halloween centers or games for the younger students to end the month. One of our Grade 6 students also led a proposal for the lunchtime Halloween dance, it was so great to see student voice in action! We have also had a few different clubs led by different Upper ELMO students start up this fall, including mini sticks, basketball, and drama! On that note, Parkside Montessori has started our own Student Advisory Council, where representatives from each class bring ideas and issues forward to make a positive impact on school culture and student learning.

In Math, we continued to focus on place value and the four operations. These important numeracy skills build the foundation for our learning all year. Students have enjoyed accessing Xtra Math which is a website that builds fluency and accuracy of basic addition, subtraction, division, and multiplication skills, ask your child how to login! We also started working with fractions, decimals, ratios and percents. Seeing how these concepts work together and applying operations to those as well has been intriguing for many. We will continue all of these numeracy-based concepts all year to build understanding and fluency. It is important to meet each child where they are in their learning and build on successes over a longer span of time.

In Language, we were able to have some friendly competition during our school Read-a-thon week. The three upper elementary classes and three upper elementary teachers compared our reading hours with a couple of graphs in the hallway! Great work reading library books, guided reading books and listening to our class novels, plus all the at-home reading too! In writing, we have been able to continue small group and one on one conferencing with students. Getting timely feedback to students is an important part of ensuring they are growing as writers. In that feedback loop, students are figuring out what the specific things they need to work on are and will continue to revise and edit their work. We know they will have some fa-

vourite pieces of writing to share with you at the upcoming Celebration of Learning!

The Grade 4 students are learning about recycling in Science and landforms and regions in Alberta. The Grade 5 students are reviewing information about Canada and its identity in Social Studies. They have embarked on a new project for Science, Team Air vs. Team Water. They will be exploring and experimenting with creating devices that float and fly as they learn about buoyancy and flight. The Grade 6 students are learning about the history of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms and creating their own Grade 6 version! In Science, they are learning about how temperature affects matter and will be building thermometers soon!

At this time of year, the students and teachers are busy assessing learning and reflecting on the first term in all subject areas. This year we have continued the new Language and Math curriculums, as well as brand new Science learning outcomes so the report card will reflect these changes. We would like to thank you for your continued support and engagement with your child's learning. Please continue to reach out to us to ask any questions you may have as Celebration of Learning and report cards approach.
