### Casa dei Bambini, Preschool & Kindergarten

We had a great October in the Casa Dei Bambini! The children have become accustomed to our routines and are able to follow the workflow of our day. Everyone is becoming more independent in choosing their own Montessori activities during work block and are receiving presentations from their teachers.

In October we drew self portraits, used our five senses to explore sunflowers and made lots of Thanksgiving and Halloween crafts. We learned about half of the alphabet's letters and sounds and created patterns in Math.

In November we will learn about Remembrance Day and attend our special school Remembrance Day assembly. We will also be learning about healthy habits such as healthy eating, personal space, and emotions.

We look forward to hosting our first Celebration of Learning of the school year on November 30, December 1st & 2nd. These are not traditional parent-teacher interviews but rather an opportunity for our students to share their learning with families in student-led conferences. Reminder, there is no school for Casa students on Friday, December 2nd as Casa teachers will be busy with Celebration of Learning. ## Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3

October brought lots of fun and learning to the lower elementary classrooms. Our class families continue to grow together as students learn to cooperate, to care for each other and to build positive friendships.

We have been very excited about the progress students are making during our work block periods. The children have been working hard to build their understanding of fundamental literacy and numeracy skills. We are working daily on our ability to hear, identify, and manipulate individual sounds. We are also building our phonics skills so that we can accurately sound out words and record them in writing. In Math, students have been exploring patterning and building their understanding of number and place value. We have been working with number lines, the hundred grid, and using a variety of Montessori materials to extend our understanding of number concepts.

In Science we have been observing the changing of the seasons. We have explored the orbit and rotation of the earth and how this creates both day and night as well as spring, summer, fall, and winter. This relates to our pattern work as we explore patterns in nature, as well as the Indigenous medicine wheel which we have been introduced to. We are learning how plants, animals and people prepare for the winter season. Students are enjoying their work on hibernation and migration.

In Social Studies we have wrapped up our mapping unit and we are beginning to explore the continents. Each class will be studying a different continent and we will rotate throughout the school year. We will explore physical geography, language, culture and customs, food, clothing, and music as we explore each continent.

The winter season has come in like a lion. Please make sure that your child is appropriately dressed for the weather each day. It is also helpful to have them practice at home how to put on their snow gear in such a way that they can be independent. This allows for them to have the optimum amount of time outside getting fresh air and exercise. We look forward to spending November with you!

## Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Greetings from Upper ELMO!

Students have been very excited to see the return of many pre-pandemic favorites such as our Halloween parades and carnival. Upper ELMO classes also experienced their first all-day field trip of the year. Students enjoyed viewing the exhibit at the art gallery and learning how to research at the library.

In Math, our focus continues on place value and operations. These important numeracy skills build the foundation for our learning all year. Students have enjoyed accessing Xtra Math which is a website that builds fluency and accuracy of basic addition, subtraction, division, and multiplication skills. We also worked with fractions and decimals, applying operations to those as well and as mentioned, will continue year long.

In Language, students received presentations, one-on-one conferencing and practice in reviewing teacher or peer feedback, continuing learning on how to create complete sentences and organize creative ideas into paragraphs. Students will continue to experiment with different types of writing such as letters and stories depending on the day of the week. They are working in small groups to build their reading skills and taking time to extend beyond the book with comprehension questions or independent activities.

Our grade sixes are wrapping up their unit on Forensic Science. They have learned all about fingerprints, footprints and other types of evidence that might be left at a crime scene. In Social Studies they are learning about the structures of government and how Canadian citizens participate in democracy.

Our grade fives are combining their learning of Canada and Electricity & Magnetism into a cross -curricular hands-on project. They will be creating an electronic trivia game based on Social Studies content and applying Science knowhow. Please keep an eye out for these at Celebration of Learning! Our grade fours are wrapping up their Alberta projects. Students will be presenting their findings to the class and together will vote on which Alberta town is the best. In Science, they are moving into learning about the Waste in our World and how to be responsible citizens when it comes to the role we play in this process.

It is a busy time of year with lots of learning to share at our upcoming Celebration of Learning. Please continue to reach out to us to ask any questions you may have about what is going on in our classrooms. We are grateful for your continued support and engagement with your child's learning and we look forward to seeing you at the end of the month for our student-led conferencing!
