Look out for a 50/50 raffle taking place this month (Draw date Dec. 15) and save your freezer space for a perogies fundraiser coming up early in the New Year!


VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

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
Casa dei Bambini, Preschool & Kindergarten

Casa students continued their learning of letter sounds and have almost completed the whole alphabet. In Math, students were exploring patterns and matching quantities to 10. We learned about Remembrance Day and began exploring healthy habits, such as healthy eating, good hand washing, and personal space.

We have a busy December ahead and lots to look forward to! We are practicing lots to perfect our Christmas songs for the concert and boy do they sound good! We will be doing lots of seasonal crafts throughout the month and a certain elf just might show up! 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Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3

November flew by and we are looking forward to an exciting December. It was amazing to see everyone at the Celebration of Learning. The kids were very excited to show their families everything that they have been learning this year. They spent a great deal of time reflecting on areas of growth and the areas that they can continue to improve on next term. If you were unable to attend your child's Celebration of Learning, please connect with their teacher to set up a time for your child to share their learning.

Miss Jen's and Mr. Josh's classes had the privilege of hosting this year's Remembrance Day assembly. Everyone did a great job fulfilling their hosting duties in a respectful and thoughtful manner. They worked very hard learning their lines, poems, and songs. We are very proud of the independence and maturity that they showed while putting together this important assembly.

Our Lower Elementary classes continue our exploration into the Montessori Cosmic curriculum by sharing The Second Great Lesson: How Life Came to Earth. This lesson shows the evolution of life on earth over time and the interconnectedness of all living things. Students were fascinated when learning about the animal kingdoms. The children were then able to explore different classifications of animals through our Montessori shelf activities. Next, we will learn about The Third Great Lesson: How Human's Came to Earth. Through this story the students will learn about how humans have changed over time and the common needs of people.

In Science, we have been finishing our unit on the seasons. We have spent a great deal of time talking about the Earth's relationship to the Sun. Students applied this knowledge to explaining the effects of the seasons on humans and other living things.

In Social Studies, we completed our unit on mapping. Each Lower ELMO class will now take turns learning about a different country around the world. Be sure to ask your child what country they are currently studying! Through these units, students will explore geography, landforms, food, clothing, religion animals and culture. These units will provide everyone with a variety of hands-on art and practical life activities to demonstrate their understanding. Students will also deepen their understanding while completing Montessori Nomenclature activities about their country.

As the temperature gets colder, please ensure that your child is dressed for the weather. We will be going outside for recess whenever possible. Students may also wish to dress in layers as the temperature can fluctuate in the classroom throughout the day.

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Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Greetings from Upper ELMO!

What a busy and fun month November was! It was so wonderful to get to visit with you at Celebration of Learning. A huge thank you out to all the families who helped with our coffee shops. Our students were so excited to learn all about marketing and sales. The highlight was getting to make use of our beautiful Practical Life room to bake and display our goods!

Students have been working hard on their writing and peer editing. They are remembering to indent new paragraphs and that paragraphs should be around one main idea. Arranging details and description within that paragraph is also important. Getting a peer to read and give feedback for what would make it flow better has been a strategy to improve our writing this month.

In Math, we wrapped up our introductory work on basic operations as well as fractions and decimals. Students enjoyed using this learning in the real-world context of our coffee shop. Applying concepts of fractions, decimals, ratios and even time to the baking, prepping, and ordering stages of a successful coffee shop really made their learning come alive! As the year progresses, we will focus on other units in math such as statistics or geometry while looping back to the more complex number concepts that were introduced in this first term.

In Social Studies, we learned about Canada. Between our focus on Remembrance Day and our guest speakers, both in-person (Honourable Mayor Jackie Clayton) and virtual (the Mayor of Iqaluit) students were able to learn about our country both in the past and present. Meanwhile our grade six students wrapped up their forensics unit and are excited to investigate a crime scene.

Our grade four students are loving watching their plants grow. The green of the plants brightens up the classrooms during this cold snap.

Music classes this month have been devoted to preparing for our upcoming concert, December 8. We encourage all students to also be practicing at home to feel more prepared if they wish. Painting continued to be a key skill developed in Art this past month and we look forward to crafting and hands-on creations in the weeks to come.

Funding from Alberta Education allows GPPSD to support students in kindergarten to grade 8 who are in need of a lunch.




