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
School Council & Fundraising Guild

Happy December!! It is sure to be a busy and joy-filled month as we prepare to welcome winter and to celebrate the season.

November was a wonderful month of learning and confidence building for our students as they worked hard to prepare for Celebrations of Learning. In this process, Casa students spent time reflecting as a group and individually to pinpoint proud moments and in goal setting. It was so exciting to see these preparations pay off as our students expertly hosted their families for their Celebrations of Learning. It was wonderful to see them grow in this way!

We also spent lots of time this past month focusing on the crucial area of Practical Life called Care of Self. These kinds of exercises encourage young children to become independent in taking care of themselves through engaging in activities such as how to wash one's hands, how to dress and manipulate elements of clothing such as buttons and zippers, how to prepare a snack, how to blow one's nose, how to brush one's teeth, and so on. The children take great joy in learning about and working on these sorts of tasks and through their learning come to feel that taking care of oneself is a positive thing. This is an important and a lifelong lesson. We will continue to encourage our students towards independence in this way throughout the year.

Starting in December, we will be undertaking a very special and top-secret kindness curriculum! We will be challenging our students to think about being kind in whole new ways and working to infuse kindness into all we do. Our work in November surrounding how animals prepare for winter helped us to grow as great wonderers. We will continue asking big questions and to take this notion of being an explorer to heart as we focus our gaze on how we can cultivate kindness in many ways. Be on the lookout for some kindness challenges that find their way home to your families and into our greater community in the month(s) ahead as well.

We're so looking forward to preparing and facilitating lots of fun and festive learning experiences for our Casa students throughout this magical month!

November was a busy month for all of us at Parkside Montessori! We started the month with a beautiful Remembrance Day Assembly prepared by Miss Jen and Mr. Josh's class. Our school choir did a great job performing "In Flanders Fields" as well. We have been super lucky with the beautiful fall weather and spending tons of extra time outside in the sunshine while we can. We also had another amazing MALT day in November as well as a special movie & popcorn afternoon for all the students. November also was the time when our students showed and shared with us all the beautiful things they are learning. They spent a lot of time planning and preparing what they would share with their families for Celebration of Learning. Well done, everyone! Thank you parents for coming and engaging with your child's learning.

As we enter a new term, we have begun some new learning opportunities and curiosities. In Social studies, we have started to investigate and discuss the Acadian community of Meteghan, Nova Scotia. Students have really been enjoying exploring Canada on Google Earth and comparing Nova Scotia to Alberta. In Math, we are continuing to reinforce our understanding of place value as well as exploring 3D and 2D shapes in Geometry, as well as reading and recording data on graphs in Statistics. In Science, we have begun our investigation on the understanding of the physical world looking through lens of matter and energy. This unit will have many light and sound experiments.

As we enter December with some colder temperatures, please make sure your children are dressed appropriately for the weather and come in layers as we will still be spending lots of time outside. Have a wonderful December.

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Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Hello from Upper ELMO!

November was done in a flash and ended with so much excitement at our first Celebration of Learning of the year. We all really enjoyed getting to spend more time with our Upper ELMO families at Celebration of Learning and we know that your children were very proud to show off their hard work. A huge part of those nights was the success of the 456 "PAX in a Cup" coffee shop! A huge thank you out to all the families who helped with our coffee shop; whether it was the baking day or the sales evenings, we could not have done it without your support! It was an amazing opportunity to incorporate the Math curriculum (Fractions, Decimals and Ratios), the Language curriculum (writing, communication, collaboration and reading); as well as a peek into the Financial Literacy Wellness curriculum (pricing, sales, costs, and donations). Getting to make use of our beautiful Practical Life room to bake and display our goods was just the cherry on top!

Students have been giving and receiving peer and teacher feedback as they continue their writing in Language. They are working on remembering to indent new paragraphs and that paragraphs should be around one main idea. Arranging details and description within that paragraph is also important. Getting a peer to read and give feedback for what would make it flow better has been a strategy to improve our writing this month and will be an effective strategy moving forward in our multi-age classrooms! The book fair also sparked some interest in a new variety of genres, authors, and discussions around books – it was great to see students recommending series to their friends!

In Math we wrapped up our introductory work on basic operations as well as fractions and decimals. As mentioned, students enjoyed applying this learning to the real-world context of our coffee shop; baking, prepping and sales made this project expand their understanding of why those Mathematical concepts are important to learn about. They will also get another opportunity to

apply their math learning as we go on a 456 bowling trip in early December. We will be starting to learn and apply statistics to our bowling 'scores.' As the year progresses, we will focus on other units in math such as algebra, sequencing or geometry while looping back to the more complex number concepts that were introduced in this first term.

Grade 4 students have been continuing exploring Alberta and magnetism. Grade 5 students played a jeopardy-style review game to test their knowledge on the regions in Canada and will be learning about the importance of Indigenous storytelling next in Social Studies. For Science, Grade 5 students completed their Air vs. Water project and just started their new unit on Weather. Grade 6 students have been exploring democracy in Social and temperature and matter in Science.
