

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# Lower Elementary, Gr. 1, 2, 3

Hello Parkside families,

We hope that everyone had a fun and restful winter break. We are excited to be back together and continuing our learning adventures.

December was full of fun, hands-on, learning opportunities. Students had a variety of occasions to participate in seasonal activities and learn about different celebrations around the world during our December M.A.L.T and Winter Crafter-noon days. Miss Jen and Miss Julianne's classes also went on a field trip to the post office to deliver Santa letters as a part of their letter writing unit. This was an excellent way for students to apply the skills that they are learning in class to a real-world situation. Our Lower ELMO classes have been working with and getting to know, their reading buddies over the past few months. This helps to build a sense of community within our school, and we are looking forward to completing more activities with our buddies in the new year! At the end of the month many of our classes participated in sock or mug exchanges. This was another excellent way for students to get to know each other's personalities in a fun and festive way.

In Science, we are planning a field trip for January. This fieldtrip will bring what they have learned during our Great Lessons to life. More information will be shared by your child's teacher later this month. In Social Studies, our grade 1-3 students are continuing with their study of the community of Meteghan. During this unit, students will be learning about the geography, people, and resources of Nova Scotia. In Math, students will be developing their knowledge of number sense. This includes concepts such as skip counting, odd/even, 1 more/1 less and place value. These skills will help to improve your child's ability to work with numbers when adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing. Please check your weekly email for the skills being practiced in your child's class. At the end of the month, we will be having our school Literacy Week. This week will include a variety of activities that showcase the fun of reading. These activities will provide students with opportunities to interact with families and classmates from our school community.

Please take an opportunity to check your child's indoor footwear and spare clothes to ensure that they still fit. Many of the students have had growth spurts since the beginning of the year. We will be monitoring the weather daily and attempting to get outside as much as possible for recess. Please ensure that your child is dressed in layers for the weather. Having outdoor gear (i.e. gloves, mittens, hats, and more) labeled will help us ensure are returned to their owners if they get dropped outside, in the boot room or hallway.

# Upper Elementary, Gr. 4, 5, 6

Greetings and a Happy New Year from the Upper ELMO team!

The first four months of our school year have flown right by, and December was a whirlwind of festive fun with one another.

Students worked on many crafting projects, practical life activities and learning which incorporated different winter celebrations. We also got to enjoy each other during the Winter Family Fair; it was amazing to hear and see the excitement in our hallways, classrooms, and gym. Brunch for Lunch was also a highlight and once again the parents and other volunteers made it a special event!

The Math focus of December was to start learning about number patterns and sequences; as well as statistics as students analyzed their bowling data. Miss Rebecca and Miss Angie also led a 456 project of graphing vote data for various popcorn flavours, such as gingerbread or 'Grinch'. It was so fun to see the engagement and enthusiasm of connecting learning outcomes to real-world experiences in our school! In the coming month, students will be using the Montessori Algebraic pegboard to investigate various number patterns and have been already using the Decanomial Beads to build winter scenes and discuss number patterns, skip counting and basic facts.


Language continues to be a favourite area of the classroom for students as we loop through various concepts. We used themes of winter, holiday celebrations, snow globes, gingerbread houses and more to spark creative thinking and writing all month long. We also explored figurative language, such as metaphors, similes, onomatopoeia, alliteration, and personification in festive classroom décor!

Grade 4 students have been learning about the people, history, and stories of Alberta; as well as various forces in Science. Grade 5 students started making mini books about Indigenous stories. For Science, Grade 5 students completed their Air vs. Water project and just started their new unit on Weather. Grade 6 students have been wrapping up Ancient Athens; as well as thermal expansion in Science.

Looking forward to January, we will be spending time reviewing the expectations and setting individual learning goals. January tends to be a time of great growth for all the students. We are committed to supporting them in their learning. As always, please reach out to your child's teacher if you have any questions about what is going on in the classroom.
